Reception

- ❧ Miss Vinter will be the class teacher.
- ❧ Mrs Williams, Budden and Mrs Leigh will be the Learning Support Assistants.
- ❧ There will be 30 children in the class.
- ❧ The children will follow the Foundation Stage Curriculum which follows on from the curriculum they will have followed in Pre-school.



Communication



- ☞ You have already seen initial information on our website.
- ☞ We hope further and more specific information will be given at a New Entrants Meeting in September. This may have to be a virtual meeting depending on the Covid guidelines at the time.
- ☞ Further guidance on reading will also be given at that meeting.
- ☞ We will be sending you a questionnaire to complete regarding your child – you will be able to write anything you would like the teacher to know about your child.

Communication

- ☞ Weekly information, including the school newsletter, 'More News' is provided by email. Daily information is given in the children's diaries.
- ☞ Information regarding trips is also made available by email.
- ☞ You may telephone/email the school at any time to ask a question.
- ☞ You will be invited to a Parent Teacher Consultation during the Autumn and Spring term.
- ☞ You may request a meeting at any time throughout the year
- ☞ You will be made aware of your child's achievement at the end of the school year in a written report.



Settling in

- ☞ A lot of time is spent in the first few weeks doing activities designed to help the children settle into school.
- ☞ Some children take longer than others – DO NOT PANIC if your child seems unsettled at the beginning.



Skills to practise before September

- ❧ Dressing/ undressing
- ❧ Putting on and fastening shoes
- ❧ Going to the toilet and cleaning themselves
- ❧ Wiping their own nose
- ❧ Holding a pencil correctly
- ❧ Pincer grip
- ❧ Listening to and talking about stories
- ❧ Learning Nursery Rhymes
- ❧ Using scissors
- ❧ Using a knife and fork

Buddies

- ☞ All children in Reception are allocated a buddy from Year 5.
- ☞ Buddies make sure the new child is not on their own at playtime.
- ☞ A buddy will show a new child where to find the toilet when their teacher is not around to ask.
- ☞ A buddy will help a new child to learn and understand the school rules and procedures.



Homework



- ⌘ Legal requirement to set homework
- ⌘ Do as much as you can
- ⌘ We expect very little at the beginning
- ⌘ Not set at the weekend to allow family time
- ⌘ Literacy, numeracy and social skills are the most important at the start
- ⌘ Do talk to a teacher if there is a problem

Lunches

- ☞ We encourage all children to have a school lunch.
- ☞ They are cooked on site by our own staff.
- ☞ They are balanced and nourishing.
- ☞ Two choices are offered.
- ☞ There is not a cost (IFSMI)

- œ Encourage Healthy Snacks from home – nutty snacks are not allowed.
- œ Water and fresh fruit is available in the classroom – please provide a named cup.


Behaviour Policy

Finance

- ❧ Cheques should be labelled with child's name and for which activity the money is payment.
