Advance Notification of Planned Works South Road and West Road Mon 3rd February

We have received notification from Essex Highways that in preparation for re-surfacing improvements scheduled for later this year, they will be trimming back vegetation encroaching on the public highway. This needs to be done before the nesting season begins.

These works are planned for **South Road and West Road on Monday 3rd February**, **between 9:30am and 2:30pm.** Traffic will be managed with Stop/Go boards and short-term delays are expected during this time.

To ensure the team has sufficient access to carry out the work safely, no parking will be permitted along the route and this will be identified by no parking cones.

Parking – Reminder

Regretfully, I have to write again about the ongoing issue of parking outside the school. Despite my reminders last week, I have received a further complaint yesterday from a neighbour about rude and inconsiderate behaviour from some of our parents.

This neighbour's driveway is regularly blocked when parents drop off/pick up from school. At times, she has been unable to access her property, as parents have also parked across the driveway when picking up from after-school clubs. When challenged, some parents have been rude and dismissive.

This week, someone actually parked ON her private driveway and when asked to move, proceeded to block the driveway! This is completely unacceptable and jeopardises the school's reputation and our good relationships with our neighbours.

I understand it is difficult to park at times but we must ensure we are respectful and considerate when parking. PLEASE DO NOT park on or block driveways!

I have asked the parking enforcement officers and the police to monitor the parking. If you park illegally, you will risk being fined.

I hope that you will co-operate with my request to ensure parking is always considerate.
